

Werewolf for Confluence

Werewolf for Confluence is a common plugin. So it could be installed like the other plugin through Universal Plugin Manager.

To install the plugin you need to login to Confluence as an administrator, and in the Administration\ Add-ons\ Manage Add-ons find our plugin by name: Werewolf for Confluence and install it.
